Interview with Pat Bradley

Dragon Boat Coach at PanAm Dragon Boat and current Head Coach Team USA Senior C National Team

Pat Bradley, 66 years old and retired from Loyalist College in Canada, moved to Tampa with his wife Liz where he is currently the Director for Camps and Clinics for PanAm Dragon Boat Association. Pat is one of the most decorated coach's in the world with over 60 international Gold medals. He and Liz, herself a multiple World Champion with Team Canada & Team USA, conduct training camps for athletes and coaches across USA and in Europe.

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Friends Don't Let Friends MISS THE BOAT, literally!

At the beginning of the 2021 season, the Southeastern Regional Dragon Boat Association (SRDBA) reminded everyone to pay their dues before March 31. The date was selected so that the clubs could get their rebate AND so that individual paddlers interested in competing at a USDBF championship would be eligible prior to the USDBF dues deadline. The USDBF recently extended their membership deadline until July 15, 2021. And SRDBA Board members are learning that some of our paddlers want to attend a National race this year, but missed the March 31 "SRDBA deadline".

We realized that we need to clarify our membership message and make sure no paddlers are left on the dock, literally. And we want to make sure all new paddlers can enjoy the value of being a SRDBA member, regardless of when they join a club.

An individual, club or festival can join SRDBA at any time. However, if an individual wants to race at Nationals this year, you must pay your SRDBA dues prior to the USDBF deadline, July 15, 2021. In addition, your team needs to be part of a club that is a SRDBA member.

Championships 101

Planning to race in IDBF Championships for Club Crews? You Need to Understand the Fine Print

THE FINE PRINT:

CR 4.3 Club Crews In IDBF Championships for Club Crews a Racer can only represent one Dragon Boat Crew. See By-Law 12.3 for the definition of a Dragon Boat Club Crew. The rules for National Crew Representation need not apply, but all competitors must have been bona fide members of the Dragon Boat Crew that they represent, for at least SIX (6) months before the Club Crew Championships in question.

CR 4.3.1. A bona fide Club Member is one that has regularly trained and/or competed for the Club Crew that they represent

during the minimum period of six months shown in 4.3. A bona fide Club Member will normally be resident in the Country in which the Club Crew is located. A Club Member who trains and competes with a Club Crew from a different Country or Territory or a geographical Region within a Country to the one in which the Club Member himself (or herself) is normally domiciled, will only be considered as a bona fide Club Member if they can prove that they have physically attended their Club to train or compete for a period of at least twelve (12) weeks, over a minimum period of two (2) racing seasons. (Nov 06) "

- This means that athletes who normally paddle with one club are **not allowed** to change club affiliations simply to compete at CCNC.
- New paddlers (either new to a geographic area or new to the sport) may have the six (6) month requirement waived.
- If your team has dissolved and you are now paddling with a different team, this can be allowed, but you should notify the CCNC committee ASAP.



🗽 Interview with a Covid-19 Expert 🗽

Dragon Boat Charleston (DBC) promotes the physical and mental wellness of cancer survivors and their community of supporters through dragon boating. Formed in 2003, we have enjoyed paddling on many levels to help our folks attain fitness wherever they may be in their health journey. Mostly, knowing there is someone next to you in the boat who shares your

experience offers support on a level that is unmatched. When the pandemic hit, we immediately had to stop all in-person programs as we work with a very vulnerable population. In March of 2020, we formed a COVID Committee that is Chaired by Alice Turner, a licensed RN and former AVP for Quality Management and Infection Prevention and Control for Trident Health System. Further, we had the guidance of our local hospital partners and that

of Dr. Cassy Salgado, a member of DBC who also is the Director of the Division of Infectious Disease. Department of Medicine at MUSC. We have representation on the committee from each of our other DBC committees so that we could more accurately share information and decisions along the way. We are lucky to have such great leadership on our committee. When it was time to look at returning to the boats in 2021, we had already created a Transition Plan that helped us keep our folks as safe as possible. We are happy to share that plan and/or our process with any Club who thinks it would be helpful! While we know that benchmarks are every-changing and that every Club and every community is different, we are hopeful that our Plan as a resource and our sharing with you our process, challenges, and outcomes will help each Club make informed decisions as well!

1. How long have you been paddling as a breast cancer survivor with Dragon Boat Charleston (DBC)? I started paddling through the DBC Cancer Survivor Outreach Program in 2012. I made lifelong friends in that outreach boat, many of whom are still active paddlers. Once that program ended and as my skill level improved, I gradually began paddling with the

BCS group. I have had the honor of paddling with this group ever since for wellness and competition. I also paddle with all cancer survivor groups and their supporters (co-survivors).

- 2. How long have you been in your current medical specialty and what is it? I am an Infectious Diseases physician and epidemiologist. I have been practicing this specialty since 2003.
- 3. With DBC's mission stating the club is a not for profit club promoting physical and mental wellness among cancer survivors and their community through dragon boating with the vision of redefining cancer survivorship why was it important that the club develop a transition plan to get back on the water with the COVID pandemic? The benefit our members receive through dragon boat fellowship and paddling cannot be measured in traditional ways. We rely on the club not only for physical fitness but for emotional support as well. DBC survivors, their friends and families have already been through all the turmoil a cancer diagnosis brings, so when the pandemic required us to

"Hundreds of MUSC employees have worked tirelessly over the last three months to prepare the Medical Center for the anticipated surge of COVID-19 patients. pause our in-person group activities, including paddling, for more than a year, it was difficult on the membership. There is nothing like the healing power of a trip down the dock and onto the water with 20 or more people who understand exactly what you have been through. DBC leadership understood the impact of the pause and the need to develop a safe way to transition back into in-person activities and paddling.

4. How did you help DBC develop their transition plan and what were some of the special considerations taken under advisement? We knew it would be a difficult task to develop a useful guide to get us back together in the everchanging landscape of recommendations from public health officials, local and state government mandates, news stories and science. The main objective of course was to keep folks. many of whom are at high-risk for poor outcomes if infected with COVID-19, as safe as possible. My training and experience offered me the opportunity to lend some assistance. We decided to use our local epidemiology of COVID-19 activity, vaccination rates and herd immunity levels to set metrics that allowed us to progress to in-person meetings. on-land exercise activities and paddling. The biggest challenge was to find the right balance of precautions (masks and social distancing) without impacting the quality of the workouts. This required weekly meetings of our COVID Committee to review all the data as well as all the feedback from our membership. We started with a very conservative approach but as the science developed and as new recommendations emerged, I think we have found a path forward that will eventually get us all back together on and off the water.
